## Carotid Artery Disease: Peripheral Arterial Abdominal Aortic

 Anultrasound is Disease (PAD): performed to screen the An Ankle-Brachial Index carotid arteries (a pair (A31) test is performed of blood vessels in the neck that deliver bood your brain) for buildup of fatty plaque. This buildup, called atherosclerosis, is one of the leading causes of stroke. Aneurysm (AAA):An ultrasound is performed to screen the abdominal aorta for the presence of an enlargement or aneurysm. AAA can lead to a ruptured aortic artery which is a life-threatening medical emergency.

Atrial Fibrillation :
A b-lead alectrocarciogram $\langle E K G$ is performed by placing sensors on the arms a and legs to screen for Atrial Fibrillation. AFib can lead to blood clots, stroke, and heart failure, and other heart-related complications. ${ }^{2}$

## Buddy Packs

How You Can You Help? It is estimated that one in six children in Missouri faces hunger on a regular basis. Studies show children who face food insecurity are more likely to have problems at school and are more likely to suffer from anx iousness and irritability. Each Friday during the school year, Camdenton schools send home a bag of nutritious food to children who rely on free or reduced price lunches. The bags include ready to eat entrees, a fruit cup, cereal and a nutritional bar with Peanut Butter once a month. The Camdenton schools are sending home approximately 250 Buddy Packs per week to students in Dog wood, Hawthorn and Oak Ridge Elementary schools plus Climax Springs. A donation of $\$ 270.00$ provides Buddy Packs for one student for the school year.
